

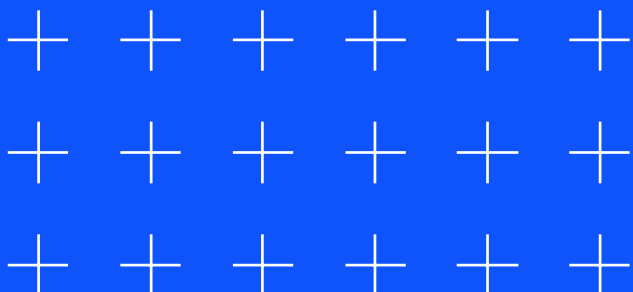

POSITION SUMMARY

This role is suitable for medical practitioners with 4 or more years' experience with an interest in (or eligible for) Addiction Medicine or Addiction Psychiatry. The registrar would be supervised by an Addiction Medicine physician (and psychiatrist for Addiction Psychiatry trainees). The role/supervisors are accredited for both Addiction Medicine (RACP) and Addiction Psychiatry (RANZCP).

The role of the registrar would be to provide, as part of the team, Addiction Medicine services including an Addiction Medicine consultation/ liaison service to the emergency department and inpatient units (including mental health wards), an outpatient service.

The registrar would be expected to assess people with a substance use disorder, provide opioid pharmacotherapy for people with opioid dependence, treat substance withdrawal, and provide relapse prevention/follow-up treatment for alcohol and other substance use disorders, often in consultation with the patients' General Practitioner and other people involved in their care.

Completion of the Opioid Dependence Treatment (ODT) or Medication Assisted Treatment of Opioid Dependence (MATOD) prior to starting the position is essential.

DEPARTMENT DESCRIPTION

The Addiction Medicine service provides consultation/liaison support to the emergency department and inpatient units at RMH, NWMH, and has an outpatient/telehealth service. In addition to the



registrar, the Addiction Medicine team consists of nursing staff, a nurse practitioner, Addiction Medicine physicians, and an Addiction Psychiatrist.



KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Take reasonable care for your safety and wellbeing and that of others.
- Work in your scope of practice and seek help where required.
- Work in partnership with consumers, patients and where applicable carers and families.
- Work collaboratively with colleagues across all RMH teams.
- Continue to learn through mandatory training and other learning activities.
- Seek feedback on your work including participation in annual performance discussion.
- Speak up for safety, our values and wellbeing.
- Prioritise wellbeing and ensure safe work practices are developed and adhered to in their area.
- Respect that the RMH is a smoke-free environment.
- To provide specialist Addiction Medicine services to Melbourne Health patients as directed by the Head of Addiction Medicine, and in collaboration with junior medical staff, Addiction Medicine nursing and nurse practitioner staff, and staff of other hospital units.
- Provide supervision for the clinical activities of the junior medical staff on the unit, according to the level of experience of the individual.
- To liaise with patients' general Practitioners to ensure patients' ongoing medical care is optimal. Availability during business hours to answer specific queries or provide advice to medical staff.
- Provide clinical input for Addiction Medicine review and other clinics
- Demonstrate a caring and empathetic approach towards patients at all times
- Ensure direct reports receive regular feedback and participate in annual discussions.
- Contribute to organisation-wide and service/division initiatives and planning activities such as MDTs and Audits.
- Ensure training needs of direct reports are identified and undertaken.
- Ensure risk management activities are completed, effective controls are in place and incidents are recorded, investigated and corrective actions implemented as far as is reasonably practical.
- Create a psychologically safe work environment where everyone feels safe to speak up. Monitor and achieve relevant KPIs and targets and operate within their allocated budget.
- To participate in ongoing assessment and competencies via college assessment forms ii. To ensure the maintenance of adequate clinical records that document significant patient management decisions.
- To ensure referrals from other units and the Emergency Department are handled in a timely manner.
- Work collaboratively and respectfully with multi-disciplinary team members to achieve desired outcomes for patients through effective communication and attendance and participation in unit and site clinical meetings
- Exchange and share information from participation in seminars and conferences with colleagues via in services, presentations, education forums, team meetings, etc.
- Participate in the development of discharge plans that reflects the needs of patients and their significant others and demonstrates understanding of the role of community providers. Assume responsibility for communication with community providers.

Formal Qualifications:

- General Registration with the Medical Board of Australia - AHPRA
- Appropriate Health professional tertiary qualifications – MBBS or equivalent

Essential:

- Currently enrolled in (or eligible for and planning to enrol in) training in Addiction Medicine or Addiction Psychiatry
- Completion of the Opioid Dependence Treatment (ODT) or Medication Assisted Treatment of Opioid Dependence (MATOD) prior to starting the position is essential
- High motivation and willingness to learn
- High level of professionalism, maturity, reliability and integrity
- Strong leadership and organisational skills
- Well-developed communication and presentation skills

- Currently or applying to be an advanced trainee in addiction medicine (not essential)
