- Participate in after-hours Echo oncall roster
- Liaise with Echo Nurse Inpatient co-ordinator on daily basis for efficient workflow planning
- Liaise with Cardiology Registrar (Echo) for inpatient triaging and workflow planning
- Ensure direct reports receive regular feedback and participate in annual discussions.
- Contribute to organisation-wide and service/division initiatives and planning activities.
- Ensure risk management activities are completed, effective controls are in place and incidents are recorded, investigated and corrective actions implemented as far as is reasonably practical.
- Create a psychologically safe work environment where everyone feels safe to speak up. Monitor and achieve relevant KPIs and targets and operate within their allocated budget.
- Assist Echo educators with planning of training/education activities in Echo
- Manage designated 'Echo portfolio' as directed by the Deputy Chief Cardiac Physiologist (Echo).

- Provide training and clinical supervision to other staff.
- Assist Deputy Chief Cardiac Physiologist (Echo) as required in administration or work planning activities.
- Actively engage in and provide professional development, modelling a commitment to lifelong learning.
- Maintain ASAR accreditation completing required continuous professional development.
- Be competent in cardiopulmonary resuscitation techniques.
- Facilitate positive team dynamics and workplace culture.

- Post Graduate qualification in Cardiac Sonography
- Current registration with the Australian Sonographers Accreditation Registry (ASAR)
- Valid Working With Children's Check (WWCC)

- Minimum of 3 of more years of clinical experience working in Cardiology with extensive knowledge in Cardiac Sonography

- Demonstrated ability to work as part of a team and modelling of interdisciplinary practice
- Demonstrated effective interpersonal and communication skills both written and verbal (including conflict resolution and negotiation)

- Demonstrated skills in research and innovation
- Demonstrated skills in program development and evaluation
