VCOR Data Manager

Victorian Cardiac Outcomes Registry (VCOR) is a large state based clinical quality registry providing information about quality and safety of Percutaneous Coronary Interventional (PCI) outcomes in Victoria .

The Data Manager is responsible for managing all data collection activities across Cardiology under the guidance of the site Principal Investigator. The role is crucial to the success of the registry. Where paper-baseline data forms are used, the data manager will be responsible for entering the data in the VCOR Registry.

VCOR access will enable the production of reports and analysing site-specific data via the VCOR system. Site raw data can be extracted from VCOR at any time by the data manager.

The role requires meticulous attention to detail and a conscientious work ethic. The data manager will be the first point of contact for all site staff enquiring about the registry.

In a 12-month period, approximately 4,500 inpatients are treated, with approximately 2,700 patients undergoing diagnostic or therapeutic procedures in the Cardiac Catheter Laboratories. Approximately 13,500 patients attend for outpatient consultations or outpatient investigations, and approximately 2,200 patients attend cardiac rehabilitation.
