

POSITION SUMMARY

The clinical/health psychology registrar provides high quality, person-centred and evidence-based clinical/health psychology services to patients of the hospital via face-to-face, telehealth and in-home care. This includes the provision of flexible and individualized assessment, therapeutic intervention and psychoeducation, as well as liaison and collaboration with other members of the multidisciplinary team. The registrar role rotates across the service, including inpatient wards and outpatient clinics and at both campuses. The clinician may be required to travel across campuses and to work within other units at RMH based on service demands. This allows appointees to work clinically across a variety of areas within the hospital, to gain experience working with clients presenting with a range of acute and chronic mental health and medical conditions. The successful applicant will receive full supervision and extensive professional development opportunities, to allow them to work towards completing their psychology registrar program. The role will be overseen by the Clinical Psychology Team Leader and Clinical Educator positions.

Allied Health Psychology is a growing, dynamic team comprised of approximately 21 EFT (neuropsychologists, clinical psychologists and health psychologists). The service operates across both the City and Royal Park campuses providing the highest level of care to both inpatients and outpatients. There is a strong culture of clinical research. The Psychology Department provides a nurturing and supportive environment that welcomes new staff and is passionate about developing the skills of early career psychologists.





KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

- Provide evidence-based clinical/health psychology assessment and interventions to clients.
- Work in rotations over the RMH Clinical Psychology service over the two-year contract.
- · Assist other psychology areas, as required.
- Maintain high level professional standards and patient centred care
- Seek feedback on your work including participation in annual performance discussion, supervision and peer observation.
- Take reasonable care for your safety and wellbeing and that of others.
- Work in your scope of practice and seek help where required.

- Contribute to Allied Health Psychology research and quality improvement projects.
- Speak up for safety, our values and wellbeing.
- Prioritise wellbeing and ensure safe work practices are developed and adhered to in their area.
- Respect that the RMH is a smoke-free environment.

- Full registration with the Psychology Board of Australia.

- Effective interpersonal and communication skills, both written and verbal.
